

1 Start Each Semester off Right

- Log into D2L, review the syllabus for each registered class ccd.desire2learn.com and confirm important dates with your professors
- Immediately add dates from the syllabus into your planner:
 - Exam dates
 - Project and homework due dates
 - Study group meeting times
 - Time to read, study and do homework
- Get your books and supplies before classes begin and review your books before the first day. www.aurariabooks.com/ or participate in the Lending Library www.edu/studentlife
- Obtain your Student ID card and RTD pass by bringing a copy of your current schedule, a valid, government issued photo ID and \$20 to Tivoli Station.
- Use your student email address to stay in constant contact with the college. Check this email regularly.

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.FAFSA.gov every year to determine eligibility to receive financial aid money such as Pell Grants and Federal Direct Stafford Loans and local CCD scholarships. Be sure to check the Work-Study box on the FAFSA for campus work opportunities and continue to apply for institutional scholarships.

- Priority deadline for the FAFSA is April 15. CCD's Title IV School Code is 009542
- Financial aid application processing takes two to four weeks. Some funds run out quickly, so start early!
- To retain Financial Aid eligibility, students must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements which include maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA and not failing or withdrawing from too many classes.

 Free online loan Entrance Counseling for first-time loan borrowers is required. The counseling will inform you about terms and conditions of receiving and repaying loans.

Pay for Classes So You Don't Get Dropped

Pay your tuition and fees in full by the payment deadline. For deadlines see CCDConnect, Student Tab. If you are approved for financial aid, confirm that your award is enough to cover the bill. Check with the cashier about FACTS (payment option).

• If you register for a course after the payment deadline, payment is due at the time you register.

Steps to Successful Completion continued

- If you miss the payment deadline, you will be dropped from classes and need to re-register. Your original classes may or may not be available.
- Access your Student Refund Account to select your refund preferences once you receive the information in the mail.

CCD Institutional Outcomes

Community College of Denver has established the following institutional outcomes:

A CCD graduate is a **Numeric Thinker**. Students will select relevant data and use several methods such as algebraic, geometric, and statistical reasoning to solve problems; they will interpret and draw inferences from data and mathematical models; they are able to represent mathematical information symbolically, graphically, numerically, and verbally.

A CCD graduate is **Personally Responsible**. Students will incorporate ethical reasoning into action; they will explore and articulate the values of professionalism in personal decision-making. They exemplify dependability, honesty, trustworthiness, and accept personal accountability for their choices and actions. Students will exhibit self-reliant behaviors, including managing time effectively, accepting supervision and direction as needed, perseverance, valuing contributions of others, and holding themselves accountable for obligations.

A CCD graduate is **Globally Aware**. Students will consider the interconnectedness of our community and world; they will understand how cultural differences (such as beliefs, traditions, religion, ethnicity, sexuality, and gender) impact personal and community participation; they are aware of the social, environmental, and economic impacts of their actions; they evaluate how technology links individuals and communities and are aware of the social, environmental, technological, and economic impacts of their actions.

A CCD graduate is an **Effective Communicator**. Students will convey meaning by writing and speaking coherently and effectively in a way that others understand; students will write and speak after reflection; students will influence others through writing, speaking, or artistic expression that is appropriate for the context and audience; students will use appropriate syntax and grammar; students will listen attentively to others and respond appropriately. Students will understand and apply conventions of effective writing and oral communication in academic, public, and professional discourse.

A CCD graduate is a **Complex Thinker**. Students will explore and evaluate multiple sources of information, which they will synthesize to solve problems; they will extract meaning from texts, instruction, experience, and other relevant sources to construct new problem-solving approaches based on their insights. Students will make relevant connections between classroom and out-of-classroom learning.

A CCD graduate is an **Effective and Ethical User of Technology**. Students will exhibit technological literacy and the skills to effectively use it; they will demonstrate the responsible application of intellectual property and privacy; students will use technology ethically and effectively to communicate, solve problems, and complete tasks; students will remain current with technological innovations.
